Charity Updates

As most of you know, our charity partner for the second quarter is the Arthritis Foundation. Randie Morgan will be at our May meeting at Saturn North to talk more about the Foundation and its work in the community. Here, though, is an overview of the services they provide:

Self-help Courses

These six or seven class courses are designed to help those with arthritis, fibromyalgia manage on a daily basis. They provide information on relaxation, exercise and joint protection.

Support Groups

The Central Ohio Chapter sponsors ongoing groups that help people living with arthritis. The groups offer the chance for friendship, emotional support and education.

Special Assistance

The special assistance program may pay for arthritisrelated medicine, equipment, and/or transportation to arthritis-related physician appointments.

Free Equipment Loan

The Arthritis Foundation has rehabilitative equipment such as walkers, wheelchairs and canes that may be loaned to clients.

Public Education

Speakers present information on a variety of topics including, but not limited to, information on medication, stress and pain management.

Free Home Assessment

An occupational therapist makes home visits to assess how well a person with arthritis is functioning in daily activities. Visit includes an introduction to devices and home adaptations that can simplify daily tasks.

Free Camp for Children with Arthritis

The Chapter, in cooperation with Children's Hospital Arthritis Center, sponsors a weekend camp for children ages 8-16 each summer.

Professional Education

Professional education seminars are designed to educate medical professionals about the latest treatment options and research in arthritis care. Courses are approved for continuing education credits.

Exercise

Water and land-based exercise programs specifically for people with arthritis. Stretching exercises are emphasized. Classes are held in communities throughout central and southeastern Ohio

Lending Library

Brochures, magazines, newsletters and videos with arthritis information are available free of charge.
